LAWSON BRIGHAM, PHD

Distinguished Professor of Geography & Arctic Policy, University of Alaska Fairbanks Senior Fellow, Institute of the North in Anchorage

Pr. Brigham is the former chair of the Arctic Council's Arctic Marine Shipping Assessment and Vice Chair of the Council's working group on Protection of the Arctic Marine Environment. Dr. Brigham is a career U.S. Coast Guard officer retiring with the rank of Captain. He has participated in more than 15 Arctic and Antarctic expeditions, including

Polar Sea's crossing of the Arctic Ocean in summer 1994.

Dr. Brigham has been a research fellow at Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, a faculty member of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy and the Naval Postgraduate School, and Deputy Director of the U.S. Arctic Research Commission. He is a graduate of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy (BS), a distinguished graduate of the U.S. Naval War College, and holds graduate degrees from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (MS) and the University of Cambridge (MPhil & PhD). His research interests span three decades and focused on the Soviet/Russian maritime Arctic, Arctic climate change, marine transportation, sea ice remote sensing, Arctic environmental protection, and polar geopolitics.

Governor Blanchard chairs the Canada-United States Law Institute and is Honorary Board Chair of the longest serving Canadian Studies Center in the U.S. at Michigan State University, his alma mater.

Consul General of Canada in Detroit United States

Douglas George is the Consul General of Canada



in Detroit, and is responsible for the States of Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana. He is a career diplomat with over 30 years of experience, and most recently served as Canada's Ambassador to Kuwait. Recognized as a trade policy expert, Mr. George has worked in numerous economic posts at Global Affairs Canada, including the Commercial Policy Division, the GATT Division, and the US Trade and Economic Policy Division. Abroad, Consul General George has directed trade policy issues at the Canadian Mission to the European Union in Brussels as well as serving as a negotiator at the Canadian mission to the GATT/World Trade Organization in Geneva.

JIANGUO (JACK) LIU

University Distinguished Professor, Michigan State University Director, Center for Systems Integration and Sustainability

A humanenvironment scientist and sustainability scholar, Dr. Liu holds the Rachel Carson Chair in Sustainability. He is University Distinguished



Professor of fisheries and wildlife at MSU and serves as director of the Center for Systems Integration and Sustainability. Dr. Liu serves on various international and national committees, is a Board Member of Reviewing Editors for *Science*, and a coordinating lead author of the global assessment of biodiversity and ecosystem services organized by the Intergovernmental Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services. He is the founder of the International Network of Research on Coupled Human and Natural Systems (CHANS-Net.org) and past president of the U.S. International Association for Landscape Ecology.

DAVID J. CLOSS

Dr. Closs is the John H. McConnell Chaired Professor of Business Administration in the Department of Supply Chain Management at MSU. His experience



has been in the development and application of computer models and information systems for logistics operations and planning, including location analysis, inventory management, forecasting and routing general consumer products, and the medical, pharmaceutical, and parts industries. Dr. Closs has contributed to logistics executive seminars across North America, and in South America, Asia, Australia and Eastern Europe. His primary interests are supply chain strategy, information systems, security, and planning techniques. He is a principle researcher in two studies completed by MSU investigating world-class logistics and supply chain capabilities.

ANNMARIE SCHNEIDER

Director, Canadian Studies Center, Director, Program Planning & Development, Institute for Public Policy and Social Research

Ms. Schneider leads one of the first and the longest serving centers focused on Canada in the U.S. The Center has expanded its international research interest



with more MSU travelers to Canada than any other country in the world. More recently, it has extended its network to include two of Canada's main ARCTIC research campuses, University of Manitoba and University of Calgary.
